INTRODUCTION

By God's design, parents are given the great honor of leading their children to know God and to grow in their walk with him.

Our desire is to partner with and equip parents, grandparents, and guardians along this journey. This wonderful journey is centered on God, enabled in the home, and equipped through the community of faith—the local church.

The Bible must be prominent in conversation and daily life with our children. Training our children in godliness is not something to be put off until they are older. In the book of Deuteronomy, God gives these instructions:

"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 ESV¹

This call was for God's people in the Old Testament and the truth remains today—the home is the center of worship. We recognize that we have a responsibility as the church to equip parents as they train their children in godliness and faith.

WHAT IS FAMILY WORSHIP?

Christian writer Patrick Kavanaugh compares family worship to a family meal. Just as with a meal, family worship becomes the time all family members come together for spiritual encouragement.² A good family meal requires intentional planning and preparation. Family worship does as well.

"Happy is the household where the altar burns day and night with the sweet perfume of family worship!"

- Charles H. Spurgeon

Family worship may seem overwhelming. Family worship does not require parents to have their children sit in rows as they are led to sing hymns together and listen to a sermon. It *is* the family taking time to read the Bible, teach truth, and pray together. Singing together or listening to doctrinally sound songs add to the experience.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY

Some parents pray with and teach the Bible to their children each night before bedtime. Others supplement bedtime stories and prayers with more structured worship times including singing and responsive readings. Some families worship together in the mornings. Others gather around the dinner table and experience this worship time together at mealtime.

Family schedules are as unique as families. While times may vary depending on the family, the key is consistency. Parents must discover and develop the time that works best for their family.

Creatively teaching the Bible to children is not limited to an intentional time of family worship. Parents can reveal the truth of God's Word through everyday life and conversations. Children are always watching and learning. Children also have many questions. These questions present parents with opportunities to teach truth.

WHAT IF YOU MISS A FEW DAYS?

There are times when well-intentioned strategies start well but after a time are dropped. This may happen with personal devotions and resolutions. If this happens, just start where you left off with no guilt. It is challenging to be consistent, but doable.

GETTING STARTED

HONORING GOD THROUGH HIS WORD

Being a good learner requires listening. As we listen to God, we must focus on what he is saying, though you likely will not hear an audible voice. God speaks primarily through his Word. Parents have the joy of teaching their children the value of listening to God through reading, studying, and hearing scripture read aloud.

1. Begin with a Good Bible

If just beginning a family worship time, begin by finding a good Bible. There are numerous translations and versions available, but the key is finding a Bible that is translated well and does not use genderneutral language.

There are primarily two categories of Bible translations available. There are word-for-word translations that seek to be as literal as possible regarding original texts. There are also thought-for-thought translations that focus on maintaining the ideas of the original texts.

Some popular Bibles are not actually translations. They are paraphrases in modern language such as *The Message*. These may be fine for personal reading but should never be used as one's primary Bible for study, teaching, and research.

Distinctives of the most popular English translations:

- **King James Version (KJV)** The KJV is mostly a word-forword translation. It presents beautiful language, with Old English terminology. There is great beauty in how this version is presented. However, the antiquated language is often difficult for new believers and children to understand. The KJV certainly has served believers well for the past 400 plus years. The KJV is written at a 12th grade reading level.
- New American Standard Bible (NASB) The NASB is the
 most literal English translation available. While preserving the
 literal accuracy of the 1901 American Standard Version, the
 NASB has sought to render grammar and terminology in
 contemporary English. Special attention has been given to the
 rendering of verb tenses to give the English reader a translation

as close as possible to the sense of the original Greek and Hebrew texts. In 1995, the text of the NASB was updated for greater understanding and smoother reading. The reading level is 11th grade.

- English Standard Version (ESV) Each word and phrase in the ESV has been carefully weighed against the original Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek to ensure the fullest accuracy and clarity and to avoid under-translating or overlooking any nuance of the original text. Archaic language has been brought to current usage and significant corrections have been made in the translation of key texts. The ESV is essentially a literal translation that seeks as far as possible to capture the precise wording of the original text and the personal style of each biblical writer. The reading level for the ESV is 7th grade.
- Christian Standard Bible (CSB) The CSB and its predecessor the Holman Christian Standard Bible (HCSB) were created using optimal equivalence, a translation philosophy that pursues both linguistic precision to the original languages and readability in contemporary English.³ The average reading level for the CSB is 7th grade.
- New King James Version (NKJV) Authors used the original King James Version as a benchmark, while working to produce and accurate and modern word-for-word translation. The average reading level for the entire text of the CSB is 8th grade.
- New International Version (NIV) The NIV is the most popular English Bible version other than the KJV. The reading level for the NIV is 7th grade. Be aware that the 2011 update of the NIV is gender neutral and not recommended.

Gender-Neutral Translations

Seeking be inclusive, some publishers have removed gender pronouns and descriptors in their Bibles translations. This is a problem as neutering the Bible of gender renders it watered-down and, in some cases, totally mistranslated.

There are times when it may be appropriate to change the word "man" to "people" but this is only when the original text shows that to be a more reasonable translation. Yet, the removing of all gender references often leaves verses stating things not originally intended. Neutering gender in scripture removes characteristics from God and Jesus that are essential to understanding the Word. In a failed attempt to be all-inclusive, this removes the individual's need for a response to the gospel.

Gender-neutral Bible translations are not recommended for reading or study. A partial list of gender-neutral Bible translations include:

2. Use a Good Bible Storybook

Storybooks are narratives of Bible stories compiled, often with illustrations, to help young children understand the characters and stories of the Bible. Good Bible storybooks are helpful and can be used when teaching children biblical truths.

3. Use Crafts/Drama/Coloring Pages, Etc.

If someone in the home enjoys do-it-yourself projects, crafts may be a good option. Some families act out biblical stories with each person in the family playing a role. These elements will be determined by the creativity of parents and the age of children. While family worship is serious, it can also be fun.

4. Listen to the Bible

Some families have taken advantage of downtime even as children are laying down for bed, to play an audio Bible. There are options

available with online Bibles and streaming sites. Some include scripture songs where verses are put to music.

HONORING GOD BY LEARNING TRUTH

Scripture memory is not a drill, nor a competition to be won. Teaching children scripture should never be done in a negative, repressive, or manipulative way. The truths of God should be taught in an atmosphere of love and special understanding of the child as he/she learns these truths over time.

1. Memorizing Scripture

This guide provides recommended scriptures for parents to memorize and study with their children. Children can quickly pick up verses and often memorize better than adults.

2. Learning Doctrine

The question and answer (also called catechism) portion of family worship is designed to help parents train their children in the key doctrines of Christianity and the church.

HONORING GOD IN PRAYER

1. Praying for Children

Teaching and modeling the Christian faith are essential, but remember, only God can transform a heart. Only God can bring conviction upon a child and only He can give them new life in Christ. Make it a daily focus to pray for each child by name. This may be done in the family worship time and throughout the day.

2. Praying with Children

Parents should lead children in prayer, showing them how to pray by modeling well. In prayer, parents show children dependance on God, his mercy and protection. Parents can teach children to adore and honor God in their prayers, using the Model Prayer (Matt 6:9-13) as the template.

General Bible Knowledge (Grades 1 & 2)

Know the Ten Commandments. *Exod* 20:3-5a, 7-8, 12-17

- 1. You shall have no other gods before me.
- 2. You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth.
